

Abstract submission deadline in Croatian or English through the <https://indico.vuv.hr/> system is **7 February 2022** at the latest.

The deadline for the note of acceptance for the abstract is continuous until **February 10, 2022**.

If the abstract is reviewed and accepted by at least one reviewer, the entire scientific or professional paper written in English according to the technical instructions is to be submitted electronically through the <https://indico.vuv.hr/> system by **15 March 2022**.

The papers undergo a double-blind peer review process, and positively reviewed papers will be published in the Conference proceedings. With the aim of enhancing the quality of papers, all authors have the possibility to submit the final version of the paper, rewritten in accordance with possible remarks from the Congress, until 28 May 2022 at the latest.

In order to be published in the Conference proceedings, the paper has to be presented by at least one or more authors at the Congress itself.

Papers from Thematic area 7 shall not be reviewed and can be presented at the Congress in the form of case studies, PowerPoint presentations, or posters. A concise summary of the case study, presentation, or poster, and the intent to present at the Congress can be submitted through the e-mail address kongres@klubselo.hr, by 30 March 2022 at the latest.

Technical instructions for writing abstracts and papers

Abstracts intended for application can be written in Croatian or English. Complete papers, including abstracts, intended for publication in Conference Proceedings are to be written in English and the authors are responsible for the technical and grammatical accuracy of the text.

For presenting papers at the Congress, the PowerPoint presentation must be in English, while the author is allowed to choose the language of their presentation.

Front separate page: information on the author and co-author(s) of the paper: first name and surname, academic title, affiliation, e-mail address.

Title of the article: written in Arial, 14pt size, centred.

The abstract of the article is given at the beginning of the paper and can contain a maximum of 250 words. It must contain a summary of the article and a list of 1 - 6 keywords. In full paper the authors should submit the abstract in English. Font: Times New Roman, size 8pt, justified.

The texts are to be written in Microsoft Word. The scope of the paper should not exceed one publishing sheet (16 standard pages, 30,000 characters, including spaces). The font of the text should be Times New Roman, size 10pt, line spacing: single, justified, written from the beginning of the line (without indentation of the first line of the paragraph) with margins: top 5 cm, bottom 5 cm, left 4.4 cm, right 4.2 cm, gutter 0 cm, header 4 cm, footer 4 cm, paper orientation: portrait. If a word or sentence in the text needs to be highlighted, italic should be used, never bold. To separate the paragraphs, use a 10pt empty line.

Footnotes are used in the text only to give additional explanations of the main text, not to refer to references. They are marked at the bottom, sequentially throughout the entire article, with Arabic numbers beginning with 1.

Chapter headings should be concise and clear, and sequentially numbered with Arabic one-digit numbers. Chapters can have subchapters up until the third level, which are numbered with two-digit, i.e. three-digit numbers (1.1., 1.1.1. etc.).

References in the text: Cited parts of the text are cited in the text itself, not in the footnotes. Citations are written in brackets, with the last name of the author and the year of publication, e.g. (Richards 2012). When quoting directly, also cite the page number (Richards 2012, 14). Do not use *ibid.* or similar, each note is cited as for the first time. For two authors, their last names and the year of publication is cited, e.g. (Richards and Wilson 2007). For referencing more than two authors, cite the last name of the first author and write *et al.* (Hall *et al.* 2000).

Images, graphs, and tables are inserted into the text itself. They need to be numbered, with the name and source of data given. They are to be numbered sequentially with Arabic numbers (images separately, graphs separately, tables separately). Source of data is to be given underneath the image, graph or a table.

References should contain all of the used sources and give complete information on the works that are cited in the text references. The list of references is to be written without the chapter number and comes at the end of the paper (after the Conclusion). It is listed alphabetically by the last name of the author, and chronologically for the papers of the same author, and is not numbered. Font: Times New Roman, size 8pt, all lines of the paragraph with 1.27 cm (hanging) indentation, except for the first line.

Internet sources: if the article has an author: *last name, initials (year), "Title of the article", available at this Internet address (the date when the page was accessed)*.
